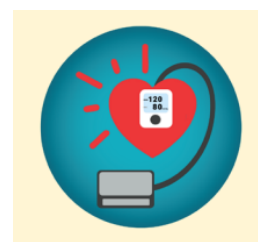

**Executive Highlights**

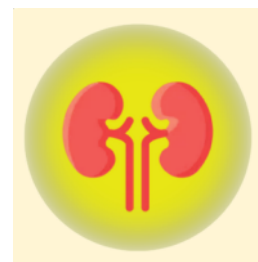
- **Total National Reach:** 496,595 screenings conducted nationwide.
- **Primary Target:** Adults aged 30 years and above.
- **Screening Scope:** Integrated assessment for **Hypertension, Diabetes, Chronic Kidney Disease, and BMI.**
- **Gender Participation:** Strong engagement from females (313,349) compared to males (183,246).

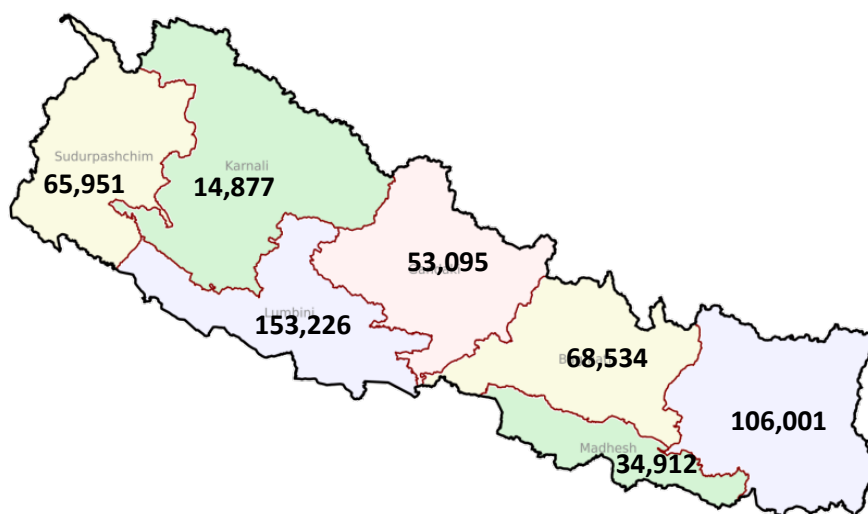

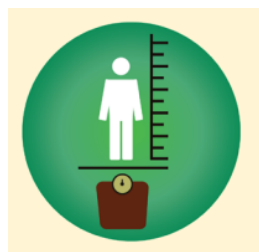

**Geographic Coverage of the campaign**



This mapping of the annual NCD Screening Month reveals regional variation in service utilization. **Lumbini Province** demonstrated the highest community engagement, accounting for approximately **31% of total national screenings**. While the integrated model proved effective in high-density regions, lower participation in **Karnali** and **Madhesh** highlights critical gaps in rural accessibility and awareness. EDCD will utilize these geographic insights to refine planning and strengthen the 'Screening-to-Care' pipeline in underserved provinces, ensuring equitable NCD service delivery.

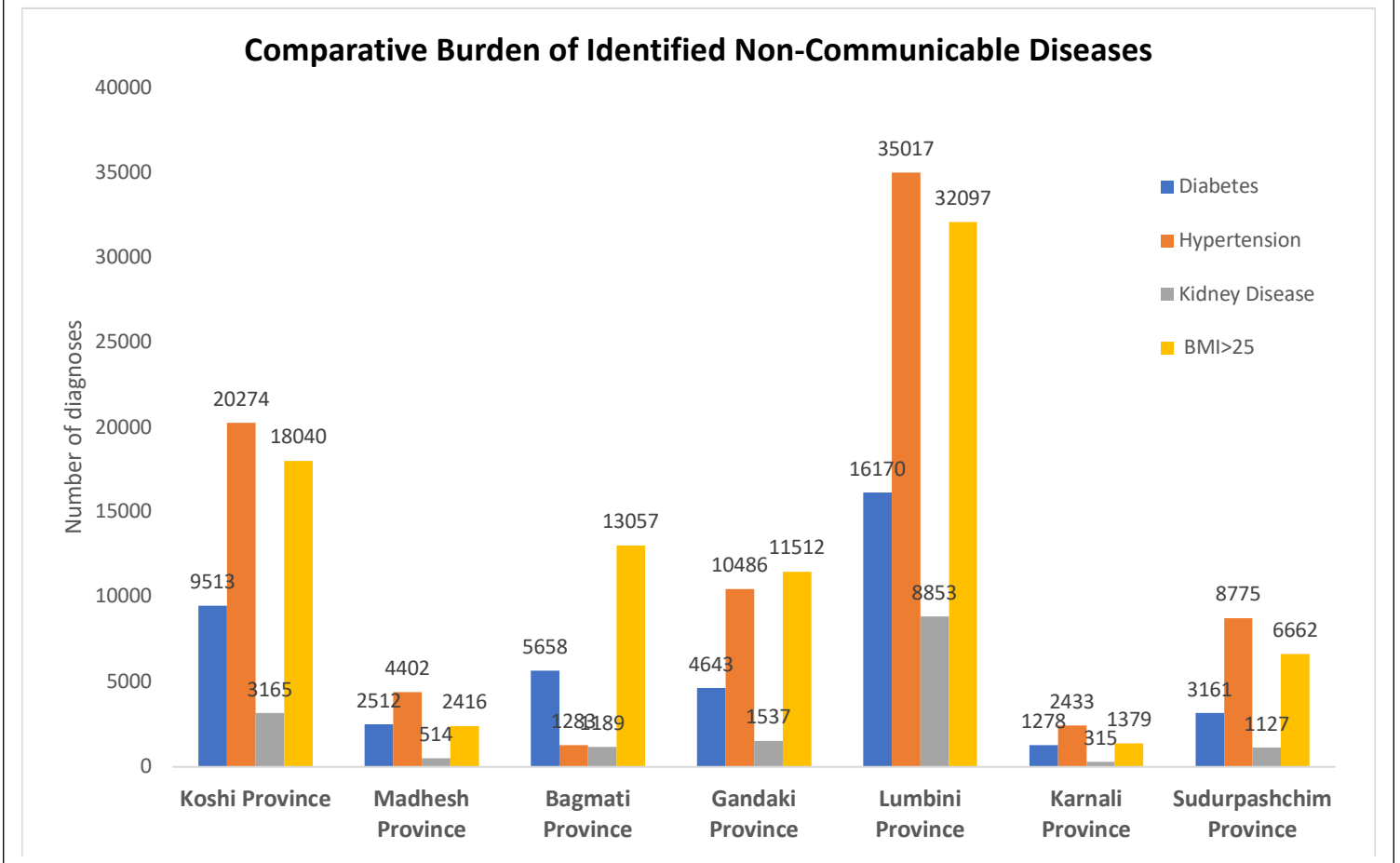

### Campaign Pillars

**Integrated Delivery:** Services were provided through a mix of fixed health facilities and community outreach to ensure maximum coverage.

**Risk-Factor Focus:** The program emphasized behavioral changes, including **tobacco and alcohol control, salt reduction, and increased physical activity.**

**Protocol Adherence:** All screenings and referrals followed the **National Package of Essential Non-communicable (PEN) Diseases** and standard treatment guidelines.
