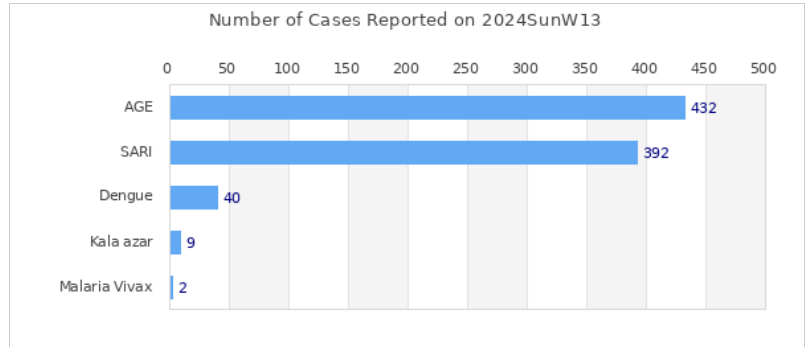




Highlights

- 1003540 cases of Corona Virus disease (COVID-19) have been confirmed in Nepal, of which 991509 cases have been recovered so far.
- Of the reported cases, AGE is the leading cause of morbidity in week 13.

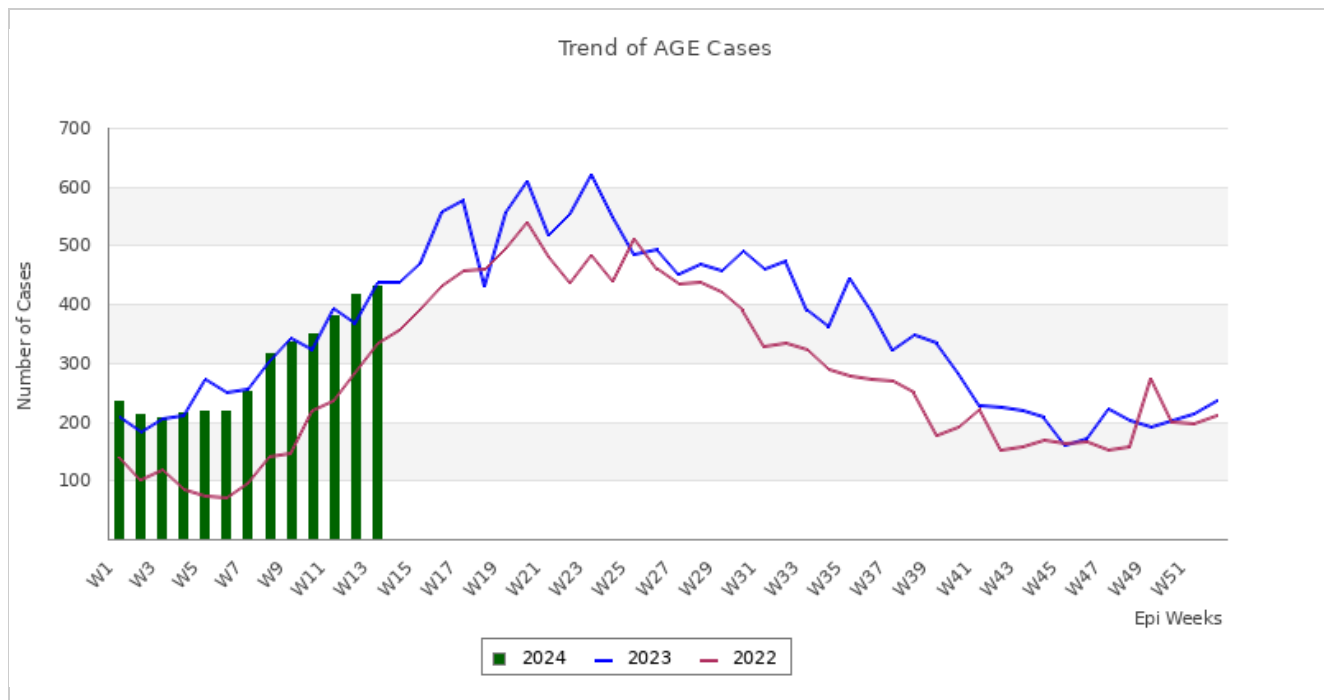


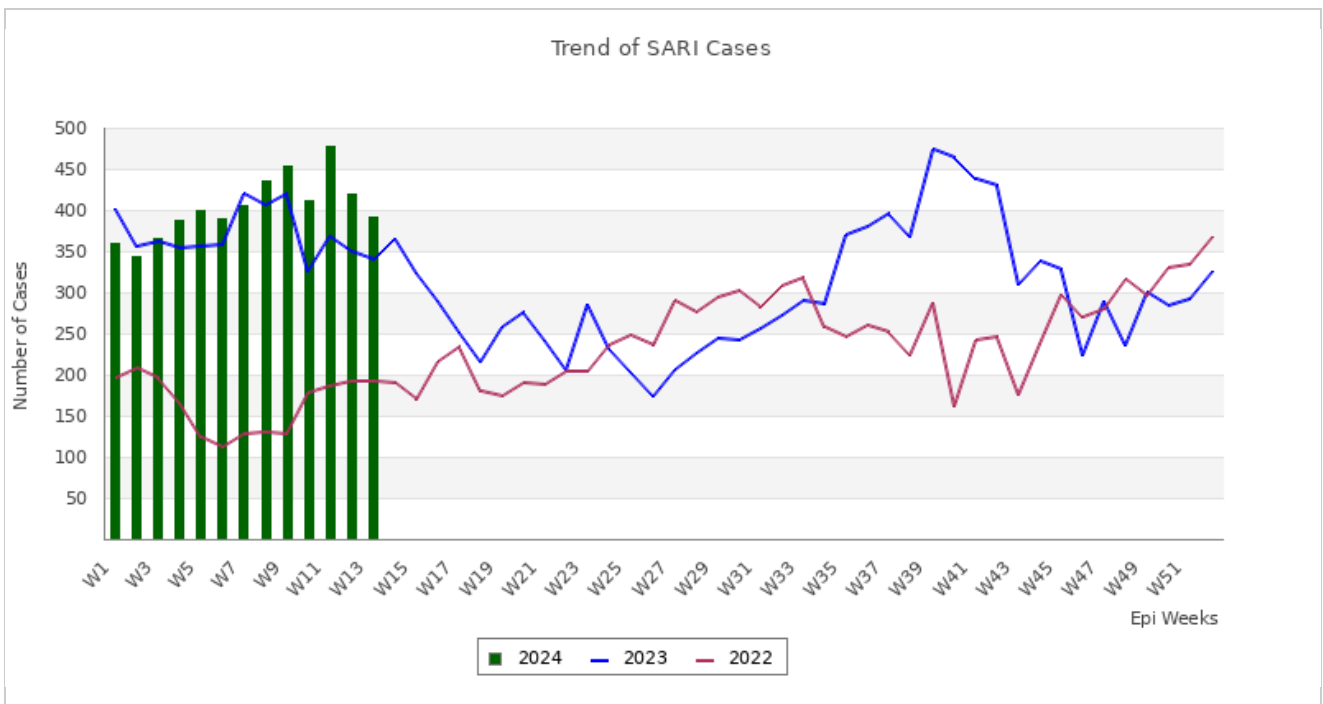
National Reporting Rate

Note: This bulletin includes data since January 2022 till date, including comparison of the same period last two year. Since, May 2019, 36 new sentinel sites (including public hospitals, private hospitals, and medical colleges) were added and was gradually oriented and started reporting, thus increasing the number of reporting sites. The current number of sentinel sites is 118.

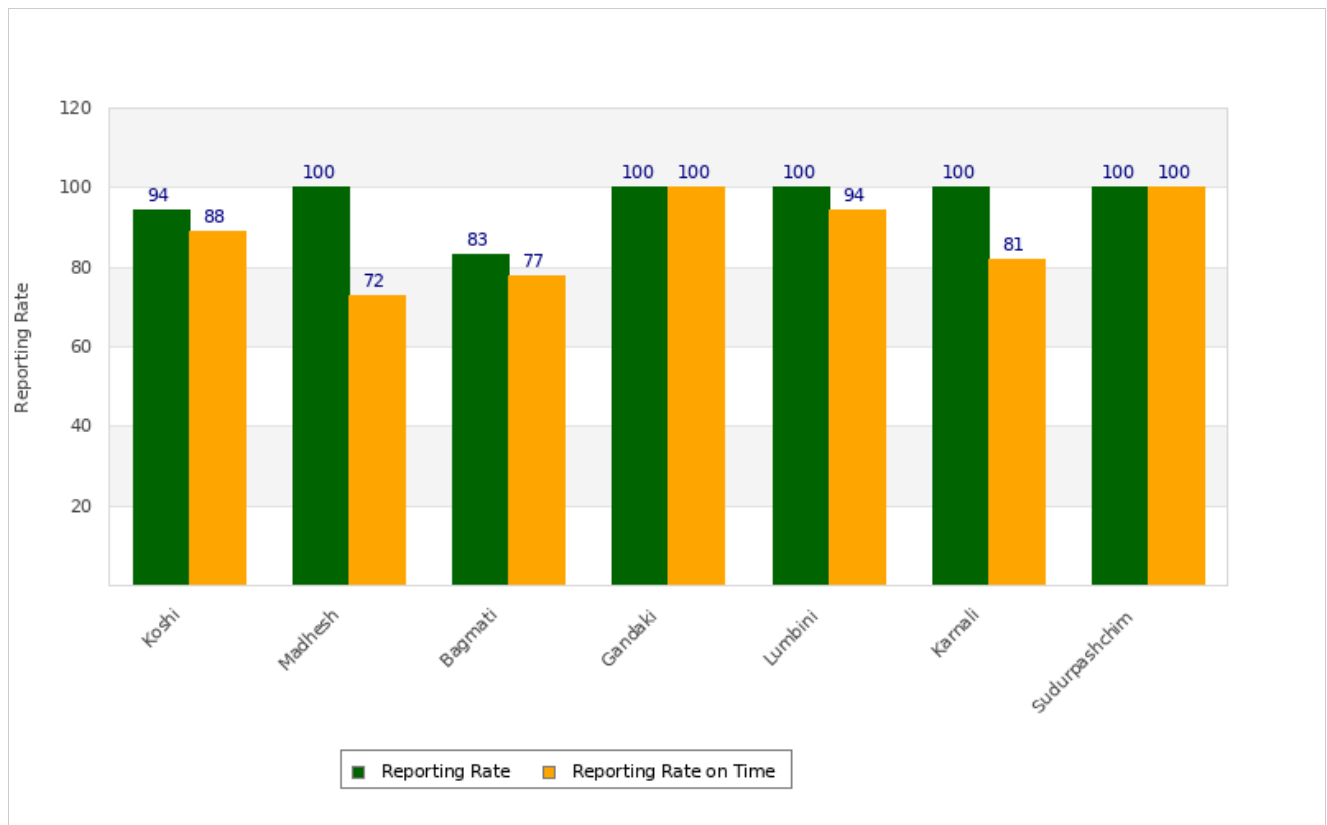

Summary Observation (Week 13, 2024):

- Most of AGE cases were reported from Kathmandu (30 case), Parsa (25 case), Sunsari (20 case), Kailali (19 case).
- Most of SARI cases were reported from Rupandehi (30 case), Morang (28 case), Kathmandu (27 case), Kailali (24 case).
- Most of the dengue cases were reported from Kathmandu (12). Chitwan and Kanchanpur (4 case from each district).
- Two cases of Malaria vivax were reported from Kailali and Bajura.
