



Highlights

Among the reported diseases, **AGE** is the leading cause of morbidity in Week 21 with **699 reported cases**.


Overall reporting rate of Week 21 is **99.3%** with **133 out of 134** sentinel sites reporting to EWARS.



This bulletin includes data since January 2022 till date, including comparison of the same period last two year. In May 2019, 36 new sentinel sites (including public hospitals, private hospitals, and medical colleges) were added and was gradually oriented and started reporting. Recently, in November 2024, 17 reporting sites selected from all the provices of Nepal were upgraded to sentinel sites, thus the number of sentinel sites are increasing. The current number of sentinel sites is 134.

Summary Observation (including probable and suspect cases)

Most of the **AGE** cases were reported from KATHMANDU (82 cases), KAILALI (43 cases), PARSA (38 cases), RUPANDEHI (29 cases) and LALITPUR (23 cases).

Most of the **SARI** cases were reported from KATHMANDU (40 cases), MORANG (21 cases), KAILALI (18 cases), BAITADI (15 cases) and RUPANDEHI (14 cases).

Most of the **Cholera** cases were reported from BHAKTAPUR (13 cases), BHOJPUR (5 cases), KAILALI (2 cases), ACHHAM (1 case) and PARBAT (1 case).

Most of the **Malaria** cases were reported from KATHMANDU (3 cases), RUPANDEHI (1 case), BAGLUNG (1 case), KASKI (1 case) and JHAPA (1 case).

Most of the **Dengue** cases were reported from PALPA (9 cases), KASKI (8 cases), KATHMANDU (6 cases), SUNSARI (6 cases) and GULMI (5 cases).


Most of the **Kala azar** cases were reported from GULMI (2 cases), KALIKOT (1 case), PALPA (1 case), JHAPA (1 case) and TAPLEJUNG (1 case).

Most of the **Scrub Typhus** cases were reported from SANKHUWASABHA (15 cases), ACHHAM (6 cases), KASKI (6 cases), GORKHA (6 cases) and DANG (5 cases).

Most of the **Enteric Fever** cases were reported from KAILALI (48 cases), KANCHANPUR (16 cases), DARCHULA (8 cases), SARLAHI (7 cases) and DADELDHURA (6 cases).

Most of the **Influenza Like Illness** cases were reported from ACHHAM (34 cases), SINDHUPALCHOK (28 cases), KAILALI (26 cases), PARBAT (24 cases) and BHAKTAPUR (16 cases).
