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The Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS)

Highlights

9026 cases of Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) have been confirmed so far in Nepal, of which 1772 cases have been discharged from the hospital.

Dengue: Five cases of dengue are reported this week-one each from Myagdi, Dhankuta, Chitwan, Nawalparasi east and Dadeldhura.

Malaria: Two cases of malaria are reported this week- one each from Dailekh and Dadeldhura.


Kala-azar: Two cases of kala-azar are reported this week- one each from Mahottari and Darchula.

The EWARS was established in 1997 to strengthen the flow of information on vector-borne and other outbreak prone infectious diseases from the district to Epidemiology and Disease Control Division (EDCD) and Vector-Borne Disease Research and Training Center (VBDRTC), Hetauda. Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) can be mobilized at short notice to facilitate prompt outbreak response at central, provincial and local levels. RRTs can also support local level health institutions for investigation and outbreak control activities.

This information system is hospital-based. So far, the EWARS mainly focuses on the **weekly reporting** of number of cases and deaths (including "zero" reports) of six priority diseases/syndromes—Malaria, Kala-azar, Dengue, Acute Gastroenteritis (AGE), Cholera and Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI), and other epidemic potential diseases/syndromes (like enteric fever). It equally focuses on **immediate reporting** (to be reported within 24 hours of diagnosis) of one confirmed case of Cholera, Kala-azar, Malaria and one case of Dengue as well as 5 or more cases of AGE or SARI from the same geographical locality in one-week period.


1. Acute Gastro-Enteritis (AGE) and Cholera

95 cases of AGE are reported this week. The majority of these cases are from Kapilvastu (7 cases), Lalitpur (7 cases) Nawalparasi west (4 cases), Kailali (4 cases) and Achham (4 cases). 384 cases of AGE were reported this week in 2019.



2. Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)

71 cases of SARI are reported this week. The majority of these cases are from Kathmandu (15 cases), Jhapa (6 cases), Ilam (4 cases), Rolpa (4 cases) and Lalitpur (3 cases). 117 cases of SARI were reported this week in 2019.



Note:

- The number of reporting sites per week in 2020: 80 (for weeks 10 and 11), 84 (for week 12), 77 (for week 13), 73 (for week 14), 74 (for weeks 15-16), 76 (for weeks 17-18), 80 (for weeks 19-20), 81 (for week 21), 80 (for week 22), 85 (for week 23) and 80 (for week 24).
- The number of reporting sites per week in 2019: 51 (for weeks 10-12), 52 (for week 13), 55 (for weeks 14-19),59 (for weeks 20-21), 58 (for week 22), 56 (for week 23) and 58 (for week 24).

3. Malaria

Two cases of malaria are reported this week- one each from Dailekh and Dadeldhura. No case of malaria was reported this week in 2019.

4. Dengue

Five cases of dengue are reported this week-one each from Myagdi, Dhankuta, Chitwan, Nawalparasi east and Dadeldhura. 24 cases of dengue were reported this week in 2019.


5. Kala-azar

Two cases of kala-azar are reported this week- one each from Mahottari and Darchula. Five cases of kala-azar were reported this week in 2019.

Other diseases

Scrub typhus

Seven cases of scrub typhus are reported this week- one each from Jhapa, Ilam, Dadeldhura, Dhankuta, Syangja, Nawalparasi east and Kailali. Four cases of Scrub typhus were reported this week in 2019.
