

# Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS)- Weekly Bulletin: Nepal

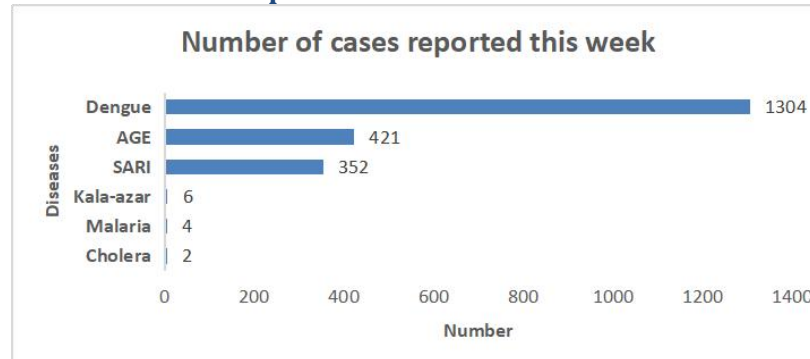
## 35<sup>th</sup> Epidemiological Week, 2023

### Sunday, 10th September, 2023

#### Highlights

- 1003424 cases of Corona Virus disease (COVID-19) have been confirmed in Nepal, of which 991350 cases have been recovered so far.
- Of the reported cases, Dengue is the leading cause of morbidity in week 35.

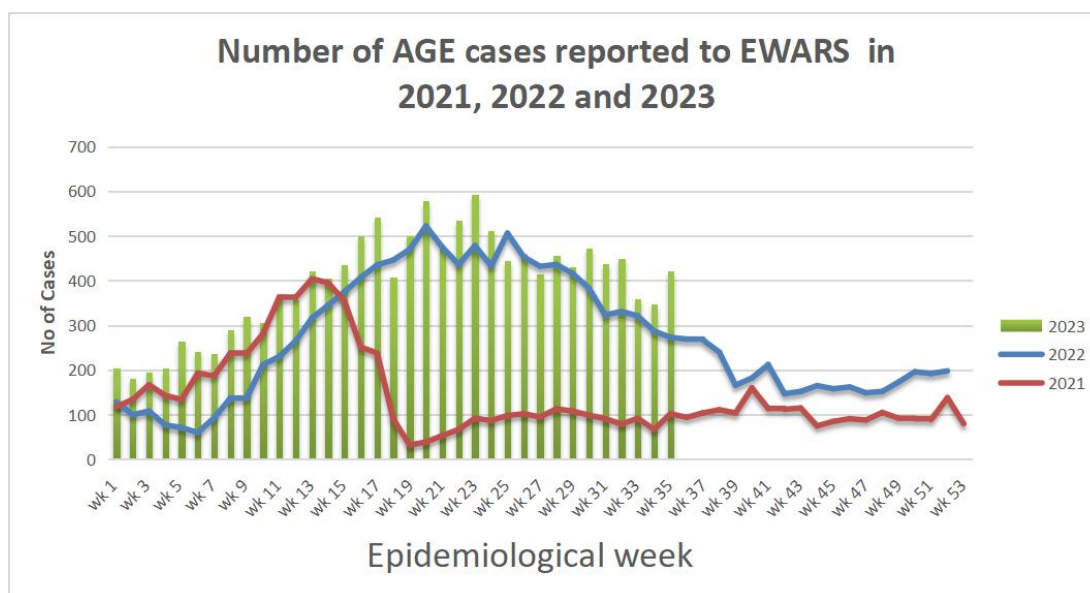
#### Number of cases reported for each disease this week



**Note:** This bulletin includes data since January 2021 till date, including comparison of the same period last two year. Since, May 2019, 36 new sentinel sites (including public hospitals, private hospitals, and medical colleges) were added and was gradually oriented and started reporting, thus increasing the number of reporting sites. The current number of sentinel sites is 118.

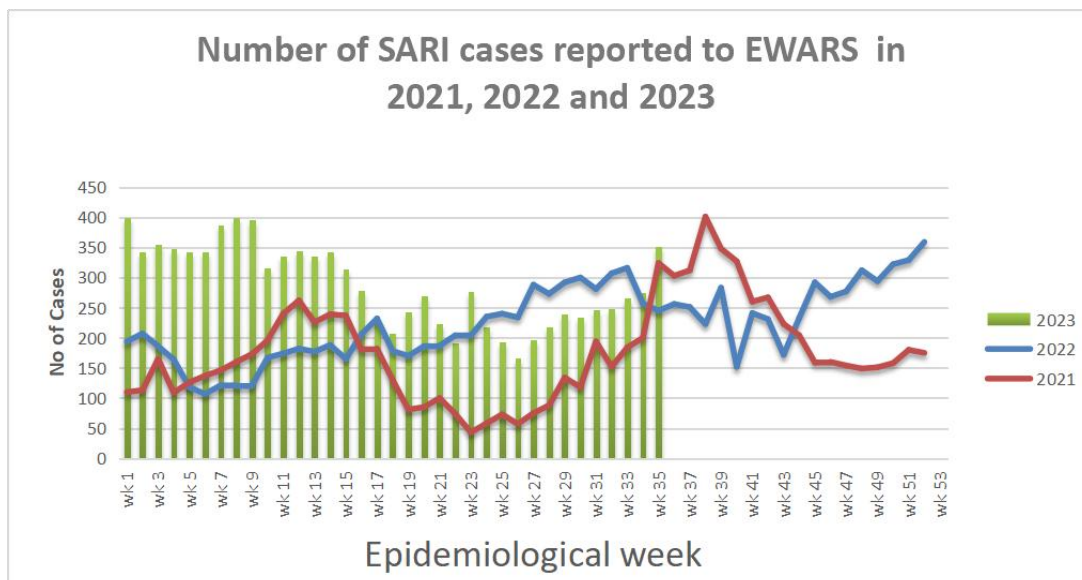
#### 1. Acute Gastro-Enteritis (AGE)

- 421 cases of AGE were reported this week. Most of these cases were reported from Parsa (53 case), Kathmandu (32 case), Rukum West (31 case), Ilam (27 case) and Saptari (22 case).
- 277 cases of AGE were reported this week in 2022.



#### 2. Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)

- 352 cases of SARI were reported this week. Most of these cases were reported from Kathmandu (33 case), Kaski (24 case), Morang (21 case), Sunsari (18 case) and Parsa (17 case)
- 245 cases of SARI were reported this week in 2022.



### 3. Malaria

- Four cases of Malaria were reported this week. Of them, two case of Malaria Falciparum were reported from Kapilvastu and other two cases of Malaria Vivax were reported from Kailali.
- Five cases of Malaria (Malaria Vivax -3, Malaria Falciparum-2) were reported this week in 2022.

### 4. Kala-azar

- Six cases of Kala-azar were reported this week. Of them, two cases each were reported from Doti and Bardiya and single case was reported from Kanchanpur and Banke.
- Eight cases of Kala-azar was reported this week in 2022.

### 5. Cholera

- Two cases of Cholera were reported this week from Kathmandu and Kailali.
- No case of Cholera was reported this week in 2022.

### 6. Dengue

- 1304 cases of Dengue were reported this week. Most of these cases were reported from Dhading (227 Case), Sunsari (176 case), Sankhuwasabha (81 case), Tanahun (73 case) and Kathmandu (67 case).
- 1455 cases of Dengue were reported this week in 2022.

### Other diseases

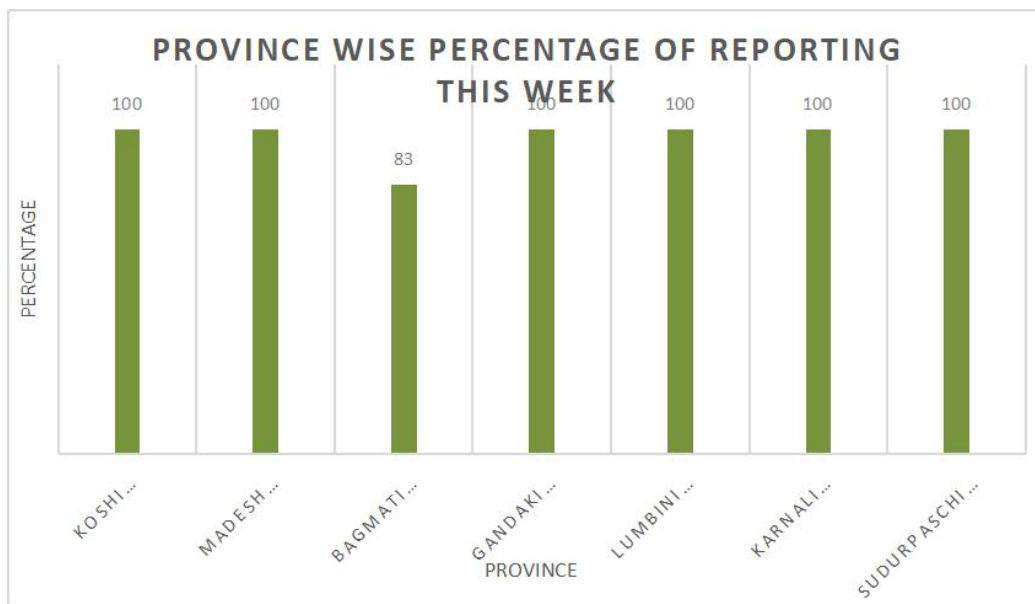
#### Scrub typhus

- 398 case of Scrub Typhus were reported this week. Of them, Udayapur (61 case), Doti (37 case), Darchula (36 case), Sankhuwasabha (29 case) and Palpa (14 case).
- 156 cases of Scrub Typhus were reported this week in 2022.

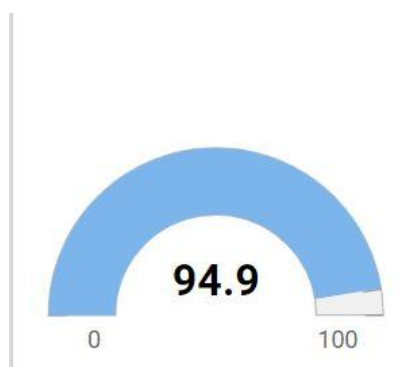
